Virginia Cancer Plan & HPV Vaccination

HPV is associated with six different kinds of cancer, including most cases of oropharyngeal cancers and almost all cases of cervical cancer. Cervical cancer is the most common HPV-associated cancer among women and oropharyngeal cancers are the most common among men.

The **Virginia HPV Immunization Task Force (VHIT)** was established in 2017 as a CACV priority task force to prevent HPV-related cancers by increasing HPV vaccination across the Commonwealth.

The **Virginia Cancer Plan** prioritizes HPV vaccination as a prevention goal working toward a vaccination rate of 80% for all 7th to 12th graders in Virginia by 2027.

The objectives of VHIT are to:

1. Facilitate partnerships across Virginia to enhance shared knowledge and best practices to increase HPV vaccination rates.
2. Decrease disparities in HPV vaccination.
3. Provide education to physicians, other healthcare providers, school officials, and the public about current national HPV vaccination guidelines.
4. Increase awareness of the burden of HPV-related cancers in men and women.

VHIT activities include education and outreach in communities across the Commonwealth to share information on HPV-related cancers and the importance of immunization to prevent these cancers. To work best, the HPV vaccine should be given in a series of shots between the ages of 11 to 12, or as early as 9.
